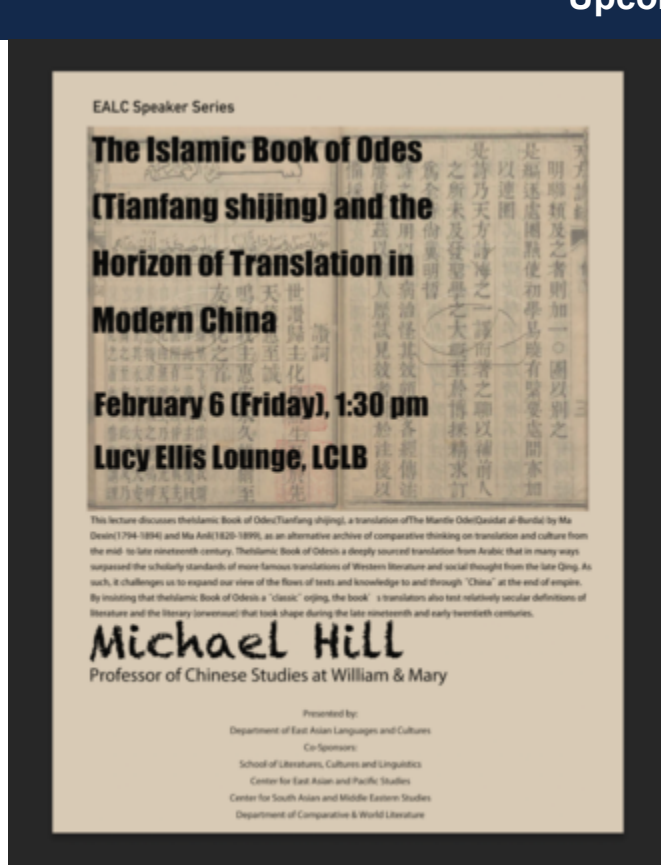

#### EALC Speaker | Dr. Michael Hill [co-sponsored event]

This lecture discusses the Islamic Book of Odes (Tianfang shijing), a translation of The Mantle Ode (Qasidat al-Burda) by Ma Dexin (1794-1894) and Ma Anli (1820-1899), as an alternative archive of comparative thinking on translation and culture from the mid- to late nineteenth century. The Islamic Book of Odes is a deeply sourced translation from Arabic that in many ways surpassed the scholarly standards of more famous translations of Western literature and social thought from the late Qing. As such, it challenges us to expand our view of the flows of texts and knowledge to and through "China" at the end of empire. By insisting that the Islamic Book of Odes is a "classic" or jing, the

book's translators also test relatively secular definitions of literature and the literary (or wenxue) that took shape during the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries.

#### Mochitsuki & Lunar New Year Event

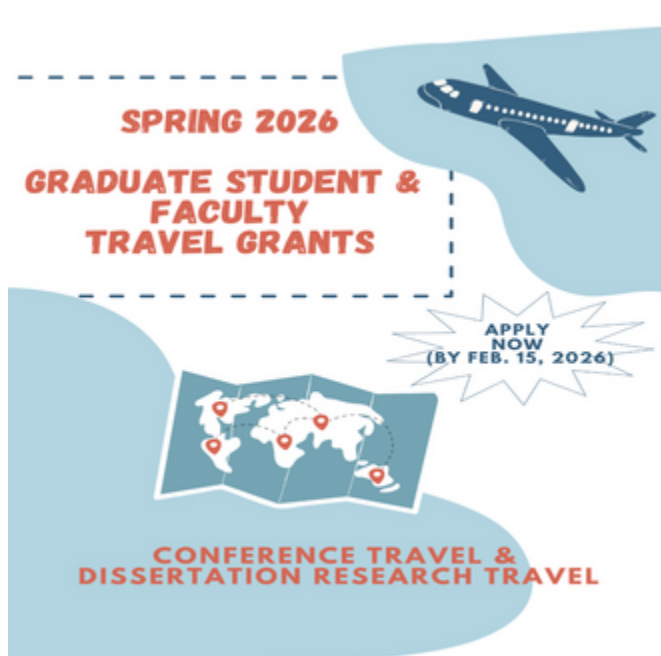

#### Graduate Student Travel Grant

Are you a grad student or CEAPS affiliated faculty looking for travel grant? We are excited to announce that CEAPS Graduate Student Travel Grant applications are now open. This Travel Grant provides travel awards for graduate students to present papers at professional conferences or to conduct dissertation research in East Asia, Southeast Asia, and the greater Pacific region. Priority will be given to those proposals that concern East Asian and Pacific issues.

#### Conference Travel

For AY 2025 - 2026, awards up to \$500 for domestic travel/up to \$750 for international travel will be granted. Paper acceptance at the time of application is required.

#### Dissertation Research Travel

For AY 2025 - 2026, 1 award (up to \$1,500) will be granted per semester to a doctoral student conducting fieldwork research in East Asia, Southeast Asia, and the greater Pacific region for periods up to 12 months.

#### IGI Fellowships Applications Open

We are excited to announce that Illinois Global Institute Language Fellowships applications are now open. IGI Fellowships provide support for language training needed to conduct research or to meet other professional development needs for University of Illinois graduate students. Two types of fellowships are available:

**Summer Research Fellowships**  
Provide up to \$3,500 related to travel costs outside of the US

**Academic Year 2026-2027 Language Fellowships**  
Provide a \$22,000 stipend and tuition waiver for eligible graduate students at the MA or PhD level. Fellows will be required to take one language course and one relevant area studies course each semester that they hold a fellowship.

CEAPS eligible languages are Chinese, Japanese, and Korean. See the website below for additional information about other supported languages and application information.

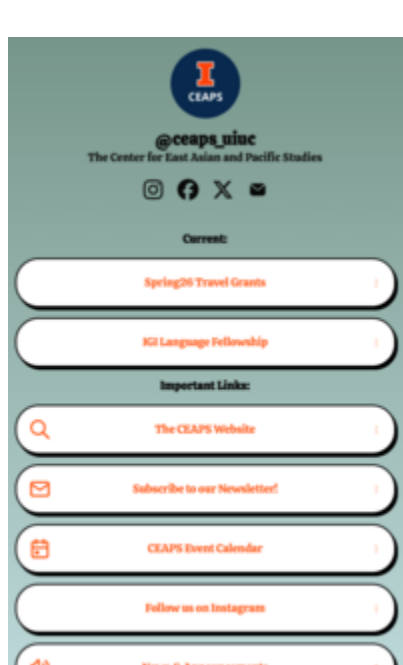
#### Spring 2026 Chinese Language Table
